Program Year 5 Action Plan Executive Summary:

A. Purpose of the Annual Plan

The City of York, York County, Pennsylvania has prepared the Action Plan as required by 24 CFR 91.220. The Plan for January 1, 2014-December 31, 2014 is being completed to identify the activities to be funded with federal funds that the City of York will receive during the program year.

B. Citizen Participation

To develop the Action Plan for FY 2014, the City of York considered the priority needs identified in the Five-Year Consolidated Plan (CP) for FY 2010 to FY 2014.

To further develop input, the city conducted two public hearings to solicit input into the preparation of the Action Plan. The meetings were advertised in the *York Dispatch* and the *York Daily Record*. All minutes of the hearings, attendance sheets, public hearing notices, and citizen comments can be found in the Appendix of this document. The first public hearing was held at the City Hall on June 26, 2013. This meeting focused primarily on informing the public of the Housing and Urban Development (HUD) entitlement funds the city receives and soliciting input as to where investment of these funds is most appropriate. The second public hearing was held on September 25, 2013 at City Hall. This meeting primarily focused on informing the public as to how the City plans to distribute HUD FY 2014 entitlement funding and reviewing past program performances.

The City of York consulted with a variety of housing, social service, and other agencies in the process of preparing its FY 2010-FY 2014 Consolidated Plan. Consultation with the York Housing Authority occurred to obtain data on the public housing inventory (including the Section 8 Housing Choice Voucher Program) and to discuss the Housing Authority's plans for public housing development activities. The City also solicited input from affordable housing developers and social service and homeless agencies that provide housing assistance and related services to low- and moderate-income persons. Survey questionnaires, focus groups, and interviews were used to obtain input. Additionally, an online survey was available for citizens to offer input on the housing and community development needs of the city; a total of 123 respondents submitted an online survey.

This information was used as the basis for formulating projects and activities to include in the 2014 Annual Action Plan.

Citizen comments received are included in the Appendix.

Copies of the FY 2014 Action Plan were distributed to various public locations for review and comment. A summary of the Annual Action Plan was published in the *York Dispatch* and the *York Daily Record* on October 1, 2013, alerting interested persons to the availability of the Annual Action Plan for public review. A copy of the Annual Action Plan was placed at the following locations in the city for public review:

City Clerk's Office, 101 S. George Street 2nd Floor, York
Mayor's Office, City Hall, 101 S. George St., York

The public review period extended from October 1, 2013 through October 31, 2013. On November 6, 2013, York City Council adopted a resolution approving the Plan for submission to HUD by November 15, 2013.

C. General Goals

During the year, the City of York will fund activities in furtherance of the priorities identified in the City's Strategic Plan for the five years from 2010 to 2014. All of the activities are high priorities.

D. Resources

Federal Resources

The national Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) and HOME Investment Partnership programs continue to be principal revenue sources for the City to address the needs of its low- to moderate-income residents.

York anticipates receiving \$1,200,000 in CDBG program funds and \$350,000 in HOME funds to finance its FY 2014 community development program. To date, the City projects no program income for CDBG and HOME. However, this projection is subject to change depending upon HUD notification of the City's actual CDBG and HOME allocation.

The City of York's 2014 Action Plan is based on 2013 CDBG and HOME allocations. The City does not anticipate a funding increase based on the political climate and uncertainty in Washington D.C. The City has compiled a short list of projects and activities for both CDBG and HOME funding, in the event that CDBG and HOME allocations exceed the planned amounts. The short list was included in the City's citizens' participation process and approved by City Council. Should the allocations for CDBG and HOME fall short of the planned amounts, all sub-recipient funding will be adjusted to correspond with the percentage shortfall.

The City anticipates that at least 70% of its CDBG resources this year, other than those allocated for administration/planning will be spent to benefit low- and moderate-income residents.

The City of York is a distressed community. In agreement with CPD 02-1, as a distressed community, the City of York is not required to provide a match for its HOME funds.

In June 2011, York County was approved by HUD to create a County/City Continuum of Care (CoC), thus officially seceding from the Central-Harrisburg Region Continuum of Care that it was a partner in since 2005. The York County Planning Commission (YCPC) led the effort to form the CoC and approached the York Housing Advisory Commission to oversee the process. Once approved, the York City and York County CoC officially became a committee of the Housing Advisory Commission. Currently, there are 47 participating agencies working within 4 subcommittees of the CoC that were formed to specifically address HMIS, the CoC application, the 10 Year Plan to end Homelessness and the review and rankings of renewal and new

homeless assistance projects competing for HUD McKinney-Vento funding via the CoC process. In the fall of 2012, the York City and County CoC submitted an application requesting 2013 HUD funds in the amount of \$1,500,000 for numerous renewal and new homeless assistance projects. In July of 2014 HUD released the funding amounts, allocating \$769,748 for renewal projects and \$19,604 for new projects. Funding will likely not be distributed until 2014.

Other Resources

No other resources have been identified.

E. Housing and Community Development Activities

The Fiscal Year 2014 Annual Action Plan for the City of York includes \$1,200,000 in CDBG program funds and \$350,000 in HOME funds to finance its FY 2014 community development program. The 2014 Annual Action Plan provides federal funds for the following activities:

Housing

The following are York's housing priorities, as stated in the CP:

- Increase homeownership
- Reduce blight and deterioration in owner-occupied housing stock
- Reduce blight and deterioration in rental housing
- Create new affordable rental housing
- Support activities for homeless and non-homeless special needs populations
- Strengthen neighborhoods
- Provide safe and accessible housing

The City plans to spend \$150,000 of CDBG funding on housing activities. The City also expects to allocate \$315,000 in 2014 HOME funds for housing activities. The

City will allocate 55.1% (\$192,753) of its HOME funds to a certified CHDO in the Homes at Thackston Park project.

Homelessness

Planning and implementation of housing and services for the homeless and prevention of homelessness in the City and region is coordinated through the state and locally by the York CoC. Strategy, goals, and action steps for ending chronic homelessness in the York Continuum of Care are formulated on a state level. The City will consider current or future requests from provider agencies of permanent supportive housing, particularly those that show results oriented projects that address a gap in agreement with the Continuum of Care.

Public Facilities and Public Infrastructure

The City will continue to budget CDBG funds in order to meet the goals of improving its infrastructure and public facilities. In FY 2014, the City will spend \$225,000 of CDBG funds for public and community facilities and public infrastructure. The funds will be used for milling, paving, reconstructing streets and sidewalks and installation of new curb ramps.

Economic Development

There continues to be the need to focus on economic development to attract new businesses, retain and expand businesses, and create decent paying jobs in York. In FY 2014, the City will allocate \$25,000 towards its Micro-Enterprise and Small Business Development Loan Assistance Program (Community First Fund).

Public Services

The City's public service goal is to support vital public services. The City's allocation of resources is directed to meeting the needs of its lowest-income residents. From the 2014 Community Development Block Grant funding, the City plans to spend \$76,347 on public service activities.

Clearance/Blight

From its 2014 Community Development Block Grant funding, the City will allocate \$49,153 for acquisition interim assistance for buildings identified as threatening the public health and safety, and \$42,500 for demolition.

Program Delivery

The City plans to allocate the following amounts for overhead costs directly involved in carrying out the programs listed below:

- Interim Assistance and acquisition - \$2,500
- Demolition - \$2,500
- CONE/Homes at Thackston Park - \$1,000

Planning/ Administration

The City plans to allocate \$240,000 of CDBG funds and \$35,000 of HOME funds towards planning and administrative activities.

F. Evaluation of Past Performance

The City of York prepared a Consolidated Annual Performance and Evaluation Report (CAPER) for FY 2012 (January 1, 2012 to December 31, 2012). The CAPER reported the FY 2012 accomplishments of the city's CDBG and HOME Programs. The following is a summary of the accomplishments detailed in the FY 2012 CAPER.

- York Homebuyer Assistance Program (YHAP) – Provided down payment and closing cost assistance to eight (8) households.
- Homeowner Rehab Assistance – Performed rehabilitation on two (2) units.
Housing Rehab – Rehabilitated two (2) vacant units for homeownership.
- Code Enforcement Program – 1,344 inspections performed on housing units in low-moderate income neighborhoods

- Demolition Program – Demolition of three (3) vacant, dilapidated buildings that are a threat to the health and safety of various low-moderate income areas
- Disposition Program – Zero (0) units conveyed by the RDA to private investors for rehabilitation
- Interim Assistance – 24 vacant units owned by the RDA cleaned and sealed
- Funding and technical assistance for micro-enterprise business development – created/retained 49 jobs
- Park Improvements – Memorial and Penn Parks: 1,984 persons benefiting
- Provided HIV testing and counseling to low- and very-low income city residents – 107 persons tested
- Acquisition Program – one (1) abandoned property acquired for resale or rehabilitation
- Rental Rehab- rehabilitated two (2) rental units for occupancy by low-moderate- income households
- Fair Housing – fair housing enforcement and education programs were provided to 158 people
- Public Improvements- Provided public improvements through public works projects and a streetscape/ repaving project on South Pine Street to benefit 11,680 persons

In FY 2012, all CDBG funds expended for activities met one of the three national objectives as defined under CDBG regulations. In FY 2012, 85% of CDBG funds were expended on activities benefiting low- and moderate-income persons.

1. Description of the Geographic Area

Priority federal funding areas in the City of York include those where there is a racial/minority concentration or a high rate of low- to moderate-income (LMI) persons. The following narrative describes the characteristics of these areas.

Population

The City of York is located in South Central Pennsylvania. Between 1980 and 2011, the City of York experienced a 1.97% decline. By comparison York County's population has continuously increased since 1980. From 1980 to the 2011, York County's population increased almost 38%, including a 13.2% rise from 2000-2011.

The City of York is a highly urbanized area with a population density of 8,308.4 persons per square mile (43,727 persons living on 5.263 square miles). In contrast, York County is much less densely populated with 474.6 persons per square mile (431,967 persons living on 910.23 square miles).

Pages 6-13 and the LMI and Minority/ Ethnic Concentration Map will be updated with current data by the final draft.

Persons by Race and Ethnic Origin

The following table presents population by race and Hispanic origin. The data is presented by Census Tract for 40,862 residents of the City of York. HUD defines areas of racial or ethnic concentration as geographical areas where the percentage of minorities or ethnic persons is 10%age points higher than the City overall.

In the City of York, minorities comprised 40% of the population. Therefore, an area of racial concentration includes the census tracts where the percentage of minority persons is 50% or higher. There were three census tracts where the 50% threshold was met.

- Census Tract 7 and 10 each had minority populations comprising 72%, while Census Tract 2 had a minority population comprising 59%.

In the City of York, persons of Hispanic origin comprised 17%. Therefore, areas of ethnic concentration include census tracts where the percentage of Hispanics is 27% or higher. There were two census tracts where the 27% threshold was met.

- Census Tract 7 had a population comprising 36%, while Census Tract 10 had a Hispanic population comprising 27%.

The Census defines the householder as the person, or one of the people, in whose name the home is owned, being bought, or rented. If there is no such person present, any household member 15-years-old or older serves as the householder.

Using HUD's criteria for determining areas of racial/ethnic concentration, three census tracts met the threshold of being 10%age points or higher than the City's overall.

- Census Tract 7 had the highest concentration of minorities (70%) and persons of Hispanic origin (28%).
- Census Tract 10 had a minority population comprising 59%, while Census Tract 9 had a minority population comprising 44%.

Ancestry

It is illegal to refuse the right to housing based on place of birth or ancestry. The Census Bureau provides data on the native and foreign-born populations.

In the City of York in 2000:

- There were 2,014 foreign-born persons residing in the City of York (5% of the population). Of these, naturalized citizens numbered 769 and accounted for 2% of the population. (Naturalization is the conferring, by any means, of citizenship upon a person after birth).
- Another 1,245 foreign-born persons (3% of the population) were not citizens and resided in the City of York.
- Census Tracts 3, 10, and 11 had higher rates of foreign-born residents than that of the City's rate of 5%.

Income Data

Median Household Income

Income trends can reveal the financial capacity of an area to support new housing construction, modernization of older housing units, and regular maintenance of existing units. Lower income households will have greater difficulty meeting their basic needs (food and clothing) and generally have less disposable income to save toward a down payment to rent or purchase a home, or to make necessary repairs on an older housing unit. Median household income is often the benchmark against which housing affordability is measured.

The following table reports on household income in the City of York. The 2000 Census reported that the median household income was \$26,475. Median household income in the City was just 58% of the Countywide median household income of \$45,268. The shaded areas in the table represent the five lowest MHI amounts in each racial/ethnic group. Two census tracts contained the lowest MHI for four (4) racial/ethnic groups. These included:

- Census Tract 2 - lowest incomes for American Indian/Alaskan Native, Other Races, Two or More Races, and Persons of Hispanic Origin.
- Census Tract 15 - lowest incomes for Blacks, Other Races, Two or More Races, and Persons of Hispanic Origin.

Low-Moderate Income Persons

The following table outlines the percentage of low- and moderate-income (LMI) persons in the City of York by census block group. This information is calculated by HUD to determine area eligibility for the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Program. LMI persons have incomes at or below 80% of the area median income level. HUD's formula for calculating the number of low- and moderate-income persons include persons residing in households and excludes persons residing in group quarters.

Based on the 2000 census data, HUD determined that there were 27,525 low- and moderate-income persons in the City, equivalent to 69% of the population for which this rate is calculated.

All census tracts in York contained at least one block group with a majority of low- and moderate-income persons (i.e. 50.1% or more). LMI data is not available by racial/ethnic minority from HUD. There were seven block groups that were below the threshold of having a 50.1% or greater LMI population; these block groups are shaded in the table below; three of these seven blocks groups were located in Census Tract 14.

2. Description of the Basis for Allocating Funds Geographically in York:

CDBG and HOME funds are intended to provide low and moderate-income households with viable communities, including decent housing, a suitable living environment, and expanded economic opportunities. Eligible activities to be funded with CDBG funds include public improvements, housing rehabilitation and preservation, affordable housing development activities, public services, economic development, planning, and administration.

The system for establishing the priority for the selection of these projects is predicated upon the following criteria:

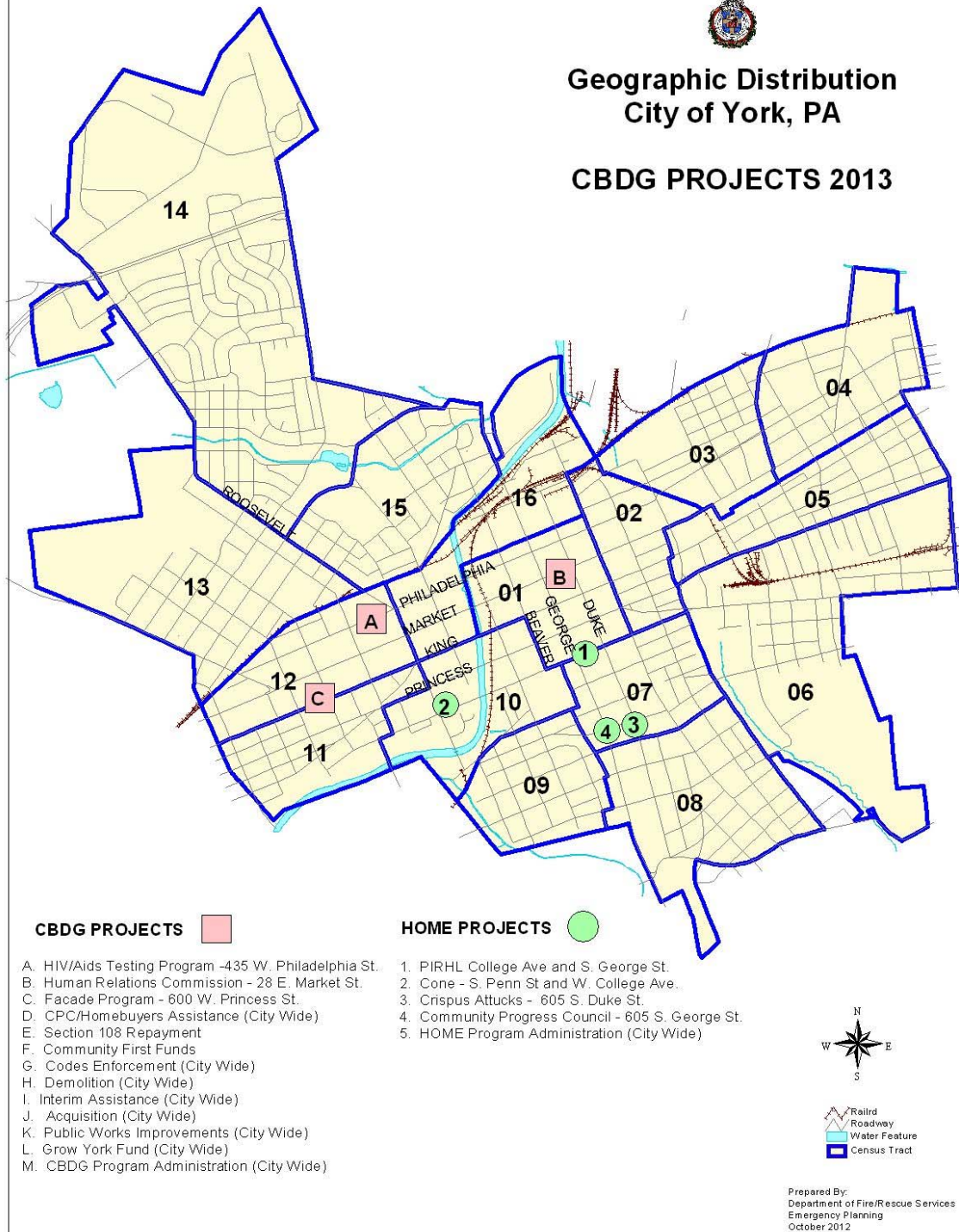
- Meeting the statutory requirements of the CDBG program;
- Meeting the needs of very-low, low-, and moderate-income residents;
- Focusing on low- and moderate-income persons, areas, or neighborhoods;
- Coordinating and leveraging of resources;
- Responding to expressed needs;
- Achieving sustainability and/or long-term impact;
- Having the ability to measure or demonstrate progress and success.

Since the City is 69% low-income, the entire City qualifies as a low-income area. Of the 11 non-administrative CDBG activities planned for FY 2014, all 10 have a citywide benefit. Of the two non-administrative HOME projects planned for 2014, one is citywide and the other is geographically targeted as displayed below.

3. Steps to Address Obstacles

The primary obstacle to meeting underserved needs is:

- Limited resources to meet the competing demands.

The City will continue to seek additional funding sources to address underserved needs.

4. Resources to Address Needs

Federal Resources

The national Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) and HOME Investment Partnership programs continue to be principal revenue sources for the City to address the needs of its low- to moderate-income residents.

York anticipates having \$1,200,000 in CDBG program funds and \$350,000 in HOME funds to finance its FY 2014 community development program. Currently, the City projects having no program income for the CDBG and HOME programs.

The City anticipates that at least 70% of its CDBG resources this year, other than those allocated for administration/planning will be spent to benefit low- and moderate-income residents.

The City of York is a distressed community. In agreement with CPD 02-1, as a distressed community, the City of York is not required to provide a match for its HOME funds.

In June 2011, York County was approved by HUD to create a County/City Continuum of Care (CoC), thus officially seceding from the Central-Harrisburg Region Continuum of Care that it was a partner in since 2005. The York County Planning Commission (YCPC) led the effort to form the CoC and approached the York Housing Advisory Commission to oversee the process. Once approved, the York City and York County CoC officially became a committee of the Housing Advisory Commission. Currently, there are 47 participating agencies working within 4 subcommittees of the CoC that were formed to specifically address HMIS, the CoC application, the 10 Year Plan to End Homelessness and the review and rankings of renewal and new homeless assistance projects competing for HUD McKinney-Vento funding via the CoC process. In the fall of 2012, the York City and County CoC submitted an application requesting 2013 HUD funds in the amount of \$1,500,000 for numerous renewal and new homeless assistance projects. In July of 2014, HUD released the funding amounts, allocating \$769,748 for renewal projects and \$19,604 for new projects. Funding will likely not be distributed until 2014.

Managing the Process

Program Year 5 Action Plan Managing the Process response:

1. Lead Agency

The City of York Department of Community Development includes the Bureau of Housing Services, the Bureau of Health, and the Bureau of Permits, Planning, and Zoning. Each of the three bureaus is headed by a Deputy Director who reports to the Director. The Bureau of Housing Services administers the CDBG and HOME programs. The Deputy Director for the Bureau of Housing Services has the direct responsibility for the oversight and management of the CDBG and HOME programs for the City of York.

Several local organizations are actively engaged in the provision of housing and housing services. These include the Community Progress Council, Housing Initiatives CDC, the Y-CDC, the York Housing Group, and the Crispus Attucks Association. Numerous neighborhood councils provide insight into neighborhood issues and concerns. The City actively seeks participation from area agencies to enhance the impact of activities.

2. Plan Process

The City of York Bureau of Housing Services Staff, in conjunction with the Citizens' Advisory Committee, developed the 2014 Annual Action Plan. A public notice seeking projects and activity applications was published in the *York Daily Record* and the *York Dispatch*. Two public hearings were held to generate public participation and input into the development of the one year Annual Action Plan (AAP). Bureau staff first reviewed the applications and then consulted the Citizens Advisory Committee to develop the one year AAP. The AAP is subject to Advisory Committee approval, public hearing and City Council approval prior to submission to HUD.

The programs and activities included in the 2014 Annual action Plan are consistent with those identified in the City's five-year Consolidated Plan.

3. Consultation and Coordination

During FY 2014, York will maintain communications with public and private housing and community development agencies to identify opportunities to develop affordable housing for low/mod and special needs populations.

Activities to be undertaken with federal funds will be coordinated with those undertaken with non-federal funds in furtherance of the City's five-year Consolidated Plan goals.

1. Citizen Participation Process

The City conducted two public hearings to solicit input into the preparation of the 2014 Annual Action Plan. The meetings were advertised in the *York Dispatch* and the *York Daily Record*. The public hearings were held in City Hall on June 26, 2013 and September 25, 2013. Minutes of the hearings, public hearing notices, and citizen comments can be found in the Appendix of this document.

Copies of the FY 2014 Annual Action Plan were distributed to various public locations for public review and comment. A summary of the 2014 Annual Action Plan was published in the *York Dispatch* and the *York Daily Record* on October 1, 2013 alerting interested persons to the availability of the Action Plan. A copy of the 2014 Annual Action Plan was placed at the following locations in the City for public review.

The public review period extended from October 1, 2013 through October 31, 2013. On November 6, 2013, the City Council signed a resolution approving the Plan for submission to HUD by November 15, 2013.

Copies of sign-in sheets and minutes from the public meetings are included in the Appendix.

Citizen comments received during the review period are also included in the Appendix.

The public identified the following needs during the planning process for the development of the 5-year Consolidated Plan:

Housing Needs

- In regard to preserving and enhancing the City's existing housing stock, there is a strong amount of support for programs aimed at helping existing homeowners in the City repair their homes and for programs that help to stimulate repairs to rental units.
- There is a high level of support for financial assistance programs for families seeking to purchase a home in the City of York.
- There is a high level of support for additional senior housing and for the expansion of accessible housing for persons with disabilities.
- In regard to homeless programs, there is a high level of support for homeless self-sufficiency programs and for homeless prevention programs. In contrast, survey responses indicate a moderate level of support for additional emergency shelters and transitional housing facilities.
- An overall lack of support exists for housing for low-wage households, ex-offenders, and migrant workers. In addition, the survey results indicate a lack of support for programs that provide housing to people with HIV/AIDS.
- Survey responses indicate a moderate level of support for housing discrimination programs and rental assistance programs for low-income households.
- Overall, survey respondents preferred rehabilitation of the existing housing stock over new housing construction to meet the housing needs of City residents. In addition, there was also a large amount of support for the incorporation of green building principles in construction and for the preservation of the City's green space.

Recreation and Public Infrastructure Needs

- Survey respondents prefer improving existing parks and recreation facilities over creating new facilities.
- There is a strong level of support for improvements to the City's existing streets, sidewalks. In addition, there was a high level of support for street lighting improvements as well.

-
- There is an overall lack of support for water and sewer service enhancements.

Public Service Needs

- There is a high level of support for literacy programs, additional senior programming, youth programs, and miscellaneous health and wellness programs and activities.
- Survey respondents indicate a moderate level of support in the City of York for more community centers, additional day care programs and facilities, and more transportation programs.
- There is significant support for life skills training programs for low- to moderate-income households in the City.

Economic Development Needs

- There is a high level of support to help upgrade existing commercial buildings and to provide financial assistance to help low to moderate income residents expand their businesses.
- There is a lack of support for programs to help business owners to purchase machinery and equipment.
- Survey responses indicate a high level of support for employment training programs in York.

Neighborhood Needs

- There is a very significant amount of support regarding the need for crime awareness and prevention activities and a higher level of code enforcement in the City.
- A moderate level of support exists for the need for more fire stations and equipment.
- Survey respondents indicate a high level of support for the historic preservation of homes and buildings and for the demolition of vacant and deteriorated structures.
- There is significant support for targeted revitalization projects in the City.

In general, the needs identified by the online survey were compatible with those identified through other citizen participation methods and supported the planned activities for FY 2011.

3. Efforts to Broaden Participation

As stated in the City of York's Citizen Participation Plan: "Spanish is the language of the largest non-English speaking group of resident in York City. At public hearings where a significant number of non-English speaking residents can be reasonably expected to participate, the City shall provide basic public hearing handouts in Spanish and/or provide a translator."

The Citizen Participation Plan also states that public hearings will be held "at a location accessible and accommodations will be provided to persons with disabilities, upon request." The City Board room and City Council Chambers, the locations of all public hearings, are accessible.

Institutional Structure

Program Year 5 Action Plan Institutional Structure response:

1. Institutional Structure

The City of York has interacted and cooperated with various agencies in the region to meet the housing and supportive needs of area low-income residents. Most of the proposed activities in the 2014 Annual Action Plan involve cooperating and partnering with state agencies, neighborhood groups, or social service organizations.

The York Housing Authority has actively pursued various programs and incentives to improve housing opportunities for lower income residents. In 2014, Creating Opportunities in Neighborhood Environments Inc. (CONE) and the City of York will continue their partnership to develop 39 affordable rental units in phase 1 of the Homes at Thackston Park Project.

During the 2014 program year, the City intends to continue to cooperate with various agencies in the region to meet the housing and supportive needs of residents.

Monitoring

1. Describe actions that will take place during the next year to monitor its housing and community development projects and ensure long-term compliance with program requirements and comprehensive planning requirements.

Program Year 5 Action Plan Monitoring response:

1. Monitoring

The City of York's Bureau of Housing Services will have primary responsibility for monitoring the CP and AP. This office will keep records on the progress toward meeting the CP goals and on the statutory and regulatory compliance of each activity.

For each activity that is authorized under the National Affordable Housing Act, the Bureau will establish fiscal and management procedures that will ensure program compliance and funds accountability and that reports to HUD are complete and accurate.

The Bureau of Housing Services carries out subrecipient Monitoring Plan.

The objectives of the Monitoring Plan are:

- To ensure compliance with Federal statutory and regulatory requirements for CDBG and HOME Programs.
- To ensure that funds are used effectively and for the purpose for which they were made available.
- To enhance the administrative and management capabilities of subrecipients through training, orientation, and technical assistance.
- To ensure production and accountability.
- To evaluate organizational and project performance.

The City uses several approaches to achieve sub-recipient compliance. These include, but are not limited to, orientation, technical assistance, program management, record management, and program monitoring.

In past years, the Bureau of Housing Services has performed financial and programmatic monitoring through reviews of requests for reimbursement, activity reports, and client benefit reports. The reports document sub-recipient progress, compliance with funding agreements, and numbers and characteristics of beneficiaries. Maintaining complete and accurate project files is an important aspect of program monitoring.

The Bureau of Housing Services also has performed monitoring visits to determine whether agencies implemented and administered CDBG/HOME funded activities according to all

applicable Federal requirements. This includes monitoring construction projects subject to Section 3, Davis-Bacon Wage Rates, Minority and Women-Owned businesses, Housing Quality Standards, Section 504/ADA, and other federal requirements.

To ensure compliance, the City monitors each sub-recipient and requires periodic, timely, and complete written reports on beneficiaries and submission of annual audits. However, due to cuts in staffing, sub-recipient monitoring has not yet occurred in FY 2013.

Lead-based Paint

1. Program Year 5 Action Plan Lead-based Paint response:

The revised federal lead-based paint regulations (24 CFR 35) have had a significant impact on many activities – rehabilitation, tenant-based rental assistance, and property acquisition – supported by the CDBG program. The increase in costs associated with adhering to these regulations significantly reduces the number of affordable housing units that can be rehabilitated with available funding.

The guidelines for the City's Housing Rehabilitation Programs comply with the lead based paint hazards at 24 CFR Part 35. Lead paint abatement is an eligible rehabilitation activity. Due to extensive lead abatement costs and the total number of highly probable lead contaminated homes, the City is more likely to pursue lead hazard reduction procedures until the total number of lead contaminated homes has been significantly reduced. While there are local contractors who are certified to undertake work involving lead hazard control, the availability of contractors is limited.

In FY 2014, the City will allocate funds to the following activities, all of which may have the effect of reducing the number of housing units with lead-based paint:

- Clearance/Demolition
- Code Enforcement
- Crispus Attucks – Rehabilitation into Rental Housing using previous year HOME allocations
- Homes at Thackston Park-New construction of 39 rental units to Benefit L-M income

All 39 townhouse units have been completed and will be rented out by the end of 2013.

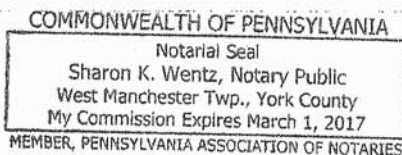

His plan calls for increasing the state's personal income tax from 3.07 percent to 4.5 percent, raising the sales tax from 6 percent to 7 percent, and adding food and clothing to the list of items currently taxed.

The introduced bill, House Bill 719, revisits prototype schools to create a template plan for the construction of new school buildings, moving school districts money on architectural and related fees.

The other two bills address a "hold harmless" clause and a constitutional amendment necessary to consider residential property taxes separate from taxes paid by commercial property owners.

"The 'hold harmless' legislation is particularly critical, as it would address the growth experienced by schools in south-central Pennsylvania and the population shift out of the western Pennsylvania," Gillespie said. "Guaranteeing a school district will not get less money than the prior year, despite a shrinking population, essentially penalizes growing school districts like those in York and Adams counties."

Reaction: Saylor said both are "good pieces of legislation, it just depends which way you want to go."

He said statewide reform would be better, but it's never been able to garner the 102 votes needed to pass the House. Even when legislation — such as last year's constitutional amendment to eliminate property taxes — passes the House, it can die in the Senate.

"So from my point of view, I'm very frustrated," he said. "I talk to constituents all the time, saying 'Why can't you get this done?'"

The short answer is that most people in most parts of the state are paying a fraction of the \$4,000 per year tax bill that many pay in York.

Six months to apply for tax/rent rebate program

Senators and people with disabilities have another six months to apply for the Pennsylvania Property Tax/Rent Rebate Program, with the state pushing the deadline from June 30 to Dec. 31.

Under the Pennsylvania Lottery-funded program, the state gives property tax or rent rebates of between \$600 and \$975 to people age 65 and older, widows and widowers age 60 and older, and people age 18 and older who have disabilities.

Last year, more than 16,000 Yorkers received checks through the program.

Checks for those who have already applied and were accepted will

be sent out July 1, while other rebates will be distributed as claims are received and processed, according to the state Department of Revenue.

The annual income limit is \$35,000 a year for homeowners and \$15,000 for renters, with half of Social Security excluded.

For an application or to check the status of a claim, visit www.revenue.state.pa.us or call 1-888-222-0190.

Free help applying is available at Department of Revenue district offices, local Area Agencies on Aging, senior centers and state legislators' offices.

"I do think Seth Grove's bill probably has more potentiality because it's local," Saylor said. "If Stan Saylor had his choice of which one passed, he'd rather do statewide. It's a cleaner way of doing it."

"Seth is a big supporter of that as well, but he realized that wasn't going anywhere ... but I think we have a shot at doing something in the House in the coming months, I really do."

Grove said he's optimistic, with Turzai having said in caucuses that he wants to run the bill in fall.

"I think that out of any of the proposals that have been introduced, this has the best chance of being signed into law and being effective."

Matter of timing: Rep. Ron Miller, R-Jenaca, said he'd like to just rework the state's entire education funding system, but he's optimistic the Grove and Gillespie proposals will at least drive discussion in a productive direction.

Miller said he's concerned that Gov.'s legislation could create competition between school districts.

"If Dallastown did a sales tax and Red Lion did the income tax, people would live in Dallastown and buy their products in Red Lion," he said.

But he co-sponsored it to advance the property tax reform debate, he said, and he's optimistic that "the climate is right for a change."

There's new growth in areas of the state where there's natural gas drilling in the Marcellus Shale, he said.

"So all of the sudden they're facing the same problems we've faced," he said. "I'm hopeful they're starting to see the writing on the wall and will come to the table willing to discuss a new way of funding education in Pennsylvania."

"I think we will probably have a very robust discussion on this topic come the fall," he said. "It's not to the point where it's going to happen."

Risk Management Examination.

► Complete eight hours of remedial education in infection control practices and policies.

► Submit a current criminal history.

► Obtain signed verification that she has not practiced dentistry while under suspension.

Upon successful completion of those terms, her license to practice could be reinstated with no less than five years' probation.

On April 29, the state board issued a 180-day suspension of Marcin's license and permit, saying her practice presented an immediate danger to public health and safety, according to legal documents.

She and her staff were interviewed by the Pennsylvania Department of State on April 2 and April 24. The state Department of Health conducted an unannounced investigation a few days later.

These investigations determined Marcin advised her staff to lie to the department's investigators about the dental office's sterilization practices, according to the documents.

Dental tools were not properly sterilized prior to reuse, documents said.

DUI issue: Marcin also failed to accurately describe her criminal record, according to documents filed with the state board.

On Dec. 16, Marcin was charged in the York County Court of Common Pleas with two counts of DUI. Her blood alcohol was at least .10 to .16, according to documents filed with the state board.

Less than a month later, on Jan. 16, she filed an online license renewal application with the state Board of Dentistry.

When asked if she had any criminal charges pending, Marcin said no, according to the documents.

Marcin knew or should have known that she had

criminal charges pending against her in York County, the documents said.

Attorney's reaction: During her 38 years of being licensed, she has no prior history of complaints, lawsuits or allegations of unprofessional conduct, said Marcin's attorney, Arthur Hoffman.

Marcin had a "very good record" and "built a busy, thriving practice" before the current incident, he said.

If her license is reinstated, she will receive monthly inspections for the first year of probation and bi-monthly inspections during the following four years, according to the agreement.

Marcin would also receive regular monitoring by state departments and a fellow dentist, consent to random office inspections, and retain an infection-control consultant.

Frank Marshall, an attorney for Marcin, said she has already hired an infection-control consultant.

The consultant, Phenolo Segal, said Marcin is now able to practice safely, according to legal documents.

"Dr. Marcin and her staff always sought to provide the best and safest care to patients," Marshall said.

At her York County practice, Marcin employed a full-time hygienist, two part-time hygienists, one dental assistant and one dental assistant/receptionist, documents show.

These employees were not at risk of infection, attorneys said.

In addition to her Springettsbury Township office, Marcin practiced dentistry as a captain in the U.S. Air Force, from which she was honorably discharged in 1990.

For 15 years she has provided free dental services at the Mitergardia Nursing Home for aging nuns and priests in Springettsbury Township, and other residents with Alzheimer's disease, Parkinson's disease and dementia, documents said.

Notifying patients: Marcin is working with the state Department of Health to start a patient-notification campaign to alert current and former patients of her dental office's lapses in infection-control procedures.

The lapses in proper sanitization puts patients at risk for hepatitis B, hepatitis C and HIV, according to the health department.

The health department last Tuesday released a statement, urging those patients to be tested for viruses.

As part of Marcin's patient-notification campaign, she is asking patients aware she will pay for the testing, Marshall said.

Also, in the case of properties owned and occupied by moderate-income (not low-income) families, an assessment or charge may be made against the property for public improvements financed by a source other than CDBG funds if the jurisdiction certifies that it lacks CDBG funds to cover the assessment.

APPENDIX E

York City Recapture Requirements

**CITY OF YORK, PA
HOME INVESTMENT PARTNERSHIPS PROGRAM (HOME Program)
RECAPTURE POLICY**

The City of York, PA provides HOME Investment Partnerships Program funds for various eligible HOME activities on an annual basis in order to provide for sale housing units to income qualified home buyers in the City. Listed below is the City's Rapture Policy under the HOME program. This policy complies with the HOME Program regulations at 24 CFR Part 92.254.

Under the HOME Program, there are certain requirements that must be placed on the properties by means of deed restrictions or a recorded note and mortgage. The City formally chooses, as required by the HOME Program regulations, to enforce the HOME period of affordability via the recapture method. The recapture policy will be in effect for a time frame equal to the period of affordability as described by the HOME Program regulations at 24 CFR Part 92.254(a)(5). Homebuyers who receive under \$15,000 in HOME funds will have a minimum affordability of five (5) years.

The City of York will recapture subsidized funds based upon a per anum rate. Within the first five (5) years following the date of settlement, the amount of assistance shall be repayable in full, less 20% per year that the borrower has lived in the property. Upon occurrence of one or more of the following:

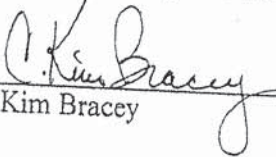
- ☐ Sale or transfer of the Real Property, except for transfer between husband and wife;
- ☐ Borrower ceases to occupy the Real Property as borrower's primary residence;
- ☐ Borrower refinances his/her mortgage obligation on the Real Property (some exceptions allowed)
- ☐ Borrower defaults under either the term of the Note or the terms of other mortgage obligations of Borrower secured against the Real Property;
- ☐ If buyer defaults (sells or moves out of the property) before the five (5) years have elapsed, the percentage due is prorated from the date of the original settlement to the same date of the month of sale. The dollar amount is divided by sixty (60) months in order to calculate the amount per month, and the monthly amount is then multiplied by the number of months elapsed to determine the amount of forgiveness by the obligee to the obligor. The difference between the original amount of the loan and the amount of the forgiveness is the amount to be repaid by the obligor to the obligee;
- ☐ In all cases where the borrower has submitted incomplete, false or misleading information in connection with the Buyer's application and/or assistance, all funds shall be subject to repayment;
- ☐ Failure to comply with the City of York's request(s) to ensure the participant still occupies the property during the affordability period.

In establishing its recapture requirements, the City of York is subject to the limitation that when the recapture requirement is triggered by a sale (voluntary or involuntary) of the housing unit, and there are no net proceeds or the net proceeds are insufficient to repay the HOME investment due, the City of York can only recapture the net proceeds, if any. The net proceeds are the sales price minus superior loan repayment (other than HOME funds) and any closing costs.
