

## On the Cover

The City of York is proud to partner with Brenda Wintermyer as our featured artist for this year's Yorkfest. Artist Brenda Wintermyer is taking her hometown of York, PA, by storm. Her vibrant, high-energy paintings have become popular in the York art scene, making Brenda's works some of York's most recognizable.

Using the skillfulness of an illustrator's hand, her linear work reflects the styles of Lautrex or Matisse. Her color palette follows van Gogh and the Fauve artists.

She moves, drips, pushes, and manipulates her medium with the confidence of a life-time painter. One art reviewer describes her approach to color as "absolutely fearless, not only bold but also brave," adding that her work is "unpredictable, unexpected, uncompromising." Brenda's collector base has been growing steadily. Undoubtedly one of York's most sought after artists, she is being commissioned by restaurant owners, international corporations, and private collectors.

Brenda teaches a variety of workshops throughout the year. Classes are small, no more than two per class, and are taught to the level of each student. Having taught at Bradley Academy, Art Institute of York, and York College of Pennsylvania for a decade, she is now able to draw upon those teaching skills in the relaxed, intimate environment of her downtown York studio gallery.

Brenda's workshops have become popular with many, from beginning to emerging artists, to creative minds looking to improve their quality of life. Her instruction has strong emphasis on drawing, which then progresses on to painting.

"Competent drawing skills are the foundation of all art. I can teach anyone to draw ... if they have the desire. I teach my students how to see correctly. Once they learn to see, the drawing comes much easier. I am passionate about my art. Teaching my knowledge of drawing is extremely gratifying. The purpose has always been to empower and inspire all those who come to share my studio with me."

#### A brief history of the event...

The Yorkfest Fine Arts Festival is York's premier summer fine arts festival along the Heritage Rail Trail and in the courtyard of the Colonial Court House. The 2016 event reflects the partnership between the City of York's former Riverwalk Arts Festival and Exhibition and the Yorkfest Music Festival, which began as part of York County's 250<sup>th</sup> anniversary celebration in August 1999, and is now an event run by York City Recreation and Parks.

#### The mission...

The Yorkfest Fine Arts Festival celebrates the arts with an annual presentation of diverse, high-quality visual, performing, and literary arts for the enrichment, education and enjoyment of Central Pennsylvania and beyond.



This year's jurors are the husband-and-wife team of Susan McDaniel and Peter Danko and York painter Marion Stephenson.

Susan has over 30 years of experience in the art and design industry, specifically focusing on advertising and graphic arts, fashion and retail, and visual communications. She attended the University of North Dakota and the University of Maryland, and has a national client list including retailers Macy's and The BonTon, National Geographic Magazine, and the United Way. Susan is a specialist in home furnishings and fashion still-life styling as well, and she continues to do free-lance photo styling today. www.susanmcdaniel.com

Peter, a graduate of the University of Maryland, has many years of experience with industrial design, woodworking, architecture, and much more. His furniture pieces have been acquired in museums including the Museum of Modern Art, the Boston Museum of Fine Arts, and the Smithsonian Institution in Washington D.C. Marion Stephenson's professional education began at Kendall School of Design in Grand Rapids, Michigan. After graduating, she went to New York City to work as a graphic designer. Marion began attending classes at the Art Students League and soon became a full-time student immersed in the study of classical painting with Frank Mason and Robert Hale. Throughout the years she also has taken workshops with Albert Handell, Burt Silverman, Max Ginsburg, and John Howard Sanden, to name a few. Marion's work has been shown in numerous galleries, solo and group shows, and juried exhibitions; the last one is the Art of the State Juried Exibition that is at the State Museum in Harrisburg. She has received awards for her paintings, the latest was Best of Show at York Art Association Juried Exhibit 2015. In her portfolio there are many public and private commissions ranging from landscape paintings, portraits, to murals. Included in her body of work are two large, outdoor murals: one for the city of York, PA ("From Farm to Market"); the other for the National Watch and Clock Museum in Columbia, PA. Three prizes will be awarded in each of the following age groups:


